Nunavut

LAWS & ANNOUNCEMENTS

Jan 31: Nunavut officially shut down its COVID-19 Hotline citing the decline in calls and cases. Those with COVID questions should now go to the GN's [COVID-19 webpage](#).

New Laws

Jan 27: The Nunavut Dept. of Community and Government Services Consumer Affairs Section began accepting [business licence renewal applications](#) for the 2023-2024 fiscal year. Businesses will have to fill out the general business application and credit card remittance form if they pay using a credit card.

New Laws

Jan 27: You might want to let your employees know that the GN issued a [public service announcement](#) reminding would-be applicants of the hazards of taking on a payday loan. "High interest rates and potential additional fees make payday loans harder to pay back, which can increase financial difficulties and stress," the bulletin warns.

Workers Comp

Feb 28: That's the deadline for Nunavut employers to submit their workers comp payroll reports and data for 2022 to the WSCC without incurring potential 2% late fees, interest and penalties.
