Immigration

Feb 22: PEI published *Temporary Foreign Workers Protection Act* [regulations](#) implementing licensing requirements individuals recruiting foreign workers must meet starting April 1. Highlights: To qualify for licenses, individuals must pay a \$100 application fee, post a \$10,000 security deposit, and be either a registered immigration consultant or member of a law society or the Chambre des notaries du Québec.

New Laws

Feb 19: PEI reported that it made inroads into satisfying residents' ever-growing demand for primary care services by hiring 41 new physicians in 2024, including 13 specializing in family medicine. In addition, 2 new physicians have been hired in 2025 so far.

New Laws

Jan 30: The federal government and PEI teamed up on new initiatives to be offered via the Sustainable Canadian Agricultural Partnership to support the province's cattle and livestock sectors, including additional funding per retained heifer or the acquisition of bred heifers, bred cows, or cow-calf pairs and incentives for feedlot and cow calf producers for increasing the availability of cattle eligible under the PEI Certified Beef marketing brand.
