Minimum Wage

Apr 10: The GN published new [regulations](#) that would provide for regular annual minimum wage increases based on the Consumer Price Index during the previous calendar year. Almost every province and territory in Canada has moved to the annual inflation-based minimum wage increase model.

New Laws

May 12: Nunavut achieved 7.5% GDP growth in 2024, nearly doubling the 3.8% growth in 2023. That's also the highest growth rate in all of Canada, easily surpassing second place Prince Edward Island's 3.6% and third place Saskatchewan's 3.4%. The other 2 territories actually recorded negative GDP growth for the year.

Health & Safety

May 1: The Department of Health warned residents of an increased risk of measles across Nunavut, citing the recent measles outbreaks in most southern Canadian provinces. The good news is that there are currently no confirmed cases of measles in Nunavut.
