New Laws

Jun 1: New *Business Corporations Act* [rules](#) require Yukon corporations to keep information identifying individuals who own, control or benefit from 25% or more of the corporation's shares, effective June 1, 2026. Corporations need only disclose this information to law enforcement, tax or regulatory authorities that request it for money laundering, international tax evasion, and other criminal investigations.

New Laws

Jun 24: In continuing response to U.S. tariffs, Yukon is eliminating 5 so-called "Party-Specific Exceptions" that bar the free flow of goods and services across provincial/territorial boundaries under the Canadian Free Trade Agreement. The exceptions being removed cover procurement, real estate licensing, forestry, fisheries, and agricultural land use.

Privacy

Aug 28: That's the deadline for Yukon residents to complete [an online survey](#) on how the law should deal with those who publish intimate images of another person without consent and support the victims of such disclosures.

Workers' Comp

May 21: Yukon's lost-time injury rate of 1.3 per 100 covered workers was a decade-low, according to the WSCB's newly released [Annual Report for 2024](#). Regrettably, there were 2 worker fatalities, as opposed to 1 in 2023. The WSCB's funded position at the end of 2024 was 138% of total liabilities.
